#### Expansion of Organic Waste Management

- Small Scale Composting Facilities
- Medium Scale Composting Facilities
- Anaerobic Digestion Facilities
- Modification of Existing Composting Facilities Regulations
  - Leaf and Yard Waste (large scale)
  - Putrescible Waste (large scale)

#### Drivers of Organic Waste Management Regulations

- Small and Medium Scale Composting Initiatives
  - Reuse Organic Wastes (leaf and yard + food)
  - Make compost
- 2. A.D. facility interest in RI
- 3. Waste Handling Hierarchy
- 4. Landfill finite life + future alternate disposal costs
- 5. Compost Law ("Food Waste Ban")

#### Food Waste Ban RIGL 23-19.9-17

#### ■ Effective 1/1/2016

- Commercial and Various Institutional Organic Waste Generators
- □ >104 tons/yr organic waste
  - Food scraps
  - Food processing waste
  - Soiled paper
  - Non-recyclable paper

#### Food Waste Ban RIGL 23-19.9-17 (continued)

- Within 15 miles of compost or A.D. Facility
- Waste Handling Options
  - Send to compost facility
  - Send to A.D. facility
  - For agricultural use (animal feed)
  - Recycle or treat on-site
- Waiver option: facility fee> RIRRC noncontract commercial tipping fee

#### Compositing and AD Facility Regulation Development Process

- OWM Regulation Development- 2014
- Initial Draft to Stakeholders- 12/2014
- Stakeholder Feedback: 12/2014-2/2015
- OWM Revision of Initial Draft: 3/2015-present
- Future Steps
  - OWM release of revised draft to public
  - Public hearing
  - OWM review of public comments + additional regulatory revisions
  - OWM preparation and Release of Final Version

#### Small Scale Composting Facility Regs-Initial Draft

- <25 yds<sup>3</sup> waste stockpile + composting wastes
- Allowed- leaf and yard waste, some food wastes, hair, sawdust, some manures
- Basic environmental requirements:
  - Surface and groundwater
  - Wetlands
  - Odors
  - Vectors
  - Dust
  - litter

Small Scale Composting Facility Regs-Initial Draft (cont.) Finished compost- Class A DEM inspection right DEM enforcement rights Cease receiving waste during non-compliance period with above requirements Note- NOT "backyard composting"

#### Medium Scale Composting Facility Regs-Initial Draft

- 25-75 yds<sup>3</sup> Waste stockpiled + composting waste
- Registration Requirement Details
- All other details- same as small scale composting regs

#### Major Differences [new vs. existing]

- Small scale facilities- no registration requirement
- Medium scale
  - Fewer details in registration submission
  - No registration fee requirement for putrescible waste
- Basic environmental compliance issues vs. detailed operating standards
- Reduced scope of allowable feedstocks due to:
  - Potential of odor problems for some putrescible wastes
  - Lack of buffer zone requirements for small/medium scale facilities

#### Key Issues for Draft Update

Medium scale composters
 Expansion of allowed types of feedstock
 Increased upper limit of materials onsite

 [from 75 to 600 yds<sup>3</sup>]

## AD Draft Regs

- Applies to all AD facilities (no size subsets)
- Licensing application:
  - Site + radius plan
  - Construction and engineering plans & specs
  - Operation plan (detailed in next slide)
  - Solids Product Marketing Plan
  - Closure Plan
- Has design and operating standards

## **Operating Plan**

#### Operating Plan that addresses:

- Waste acceptance/storage/processing
- Digestion
- Biogas handling and head/power generation
- Solids digestate handling/processing into compost/fertilizers
- Liquid digestate handling
- Waste water removals
- Odor control measures
- Other housekeeping tasks
- Safety issues (fires, methane gas, etc.)
- Emergency Contingency Plans + substitute disposal option

#### **AD Facility Proposals**

- For Johnston + Quonset Point Sites
- 2 OWM applications submitted (using putrescible waste composting regs)
- OWM has reviewed applications
- OWM comments generated in application details [updating of applications needed]
- Final AD regs will require additional application information submitted licensing procedures:
  - Workshop, hearing, public comments
- Also require air permitting
