


RGGI – Cap Overview

- First mandatory carbon cap and trade program in the US; 10 states: CT, DE, MA, ME, MD, NH, NJ, NY, RI, VT
- Electric power units over 25 MWs; Reduce emissions 10% below 2009 levels by 2019; 3.3% offset usage for compliance




Energy Consumption in New England:

Had anticipated 1+% load growth – instead flat





RGGI – Status Check


- RGGI is working well
- Adjusting the cap in second compliance period beginning 2012
- Spending auction proceeds
 - □ Bird-dogging state programs
- Offsets
 - Minimal interest to-date (low prices)
 - Proposed projects:
 - End-use fossil efficiency in MA
 - SF₆ emission reduction in NY
- Market behavior
 - Strong participation; secondary trading (Chicago Climate Exchange and bilaterally)
